REGULATION: EEA STUDENT TRANSPORTATION–Carry-on Items

Seine River School Division will follow and enforce the Manitoba Regulation 465/88 being a regulation under the Public Schools Act respecting school buses:

ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDELINES

1. Centre aisle of buses must be clear of people, articles and debris at all times.
2. Regular Bus Routes (A.M. – P.M)
 - a) Items being carried on by students are limited normally to small articles that can be easily and safely carried on the lap. (An article wider than the pupil's lap or extending above the shoulders normally is not considered a small article). Larger musical instruments need to be held by the student between their legs.
 - b) Skates will be allowed only when blades are enclosed in proper skate guards and carried on the pupil's lap.
 - c) Hockey sticks, ringette sticks, curling brooms, skis, toboggans, baseball bats etc. will not be allowed.
 - d) Musical instruments in cases, Science projects, Industrial Arts projects, etc. will be allowed only if they meet the criteria stipulated in item 2 a).
 - e) However, the following musical instruments in cases are:

Eligible

Flute, Clarinet, Alto Clarinet, Trumpet
Alto Sax, Trombone, Bass Clarinet,
Violin, Viola

Not Eligible

Bari-Sax, French Horn, Tuba
Tenor Sax, Guitar*, Cello, Upright Bass
(Bass viol)

* Guitar allowed only if in a soft case

Any musical instrument larger than specified has to be cleared by the Transportation Supervisor.

3. Extra-curricular Outings:
Items larger than those specified in item #2 above may be allowed on the bus as long as they can be safely secured in the bus.
