1. Students attending another school for these courses will have to adhere to the regulations of the receiving school and the Principal of the receiving school will be responsible for the students. The teacher will answer to the principal of the students for the academic performance.
2. Teachers must make themselves available to the parent of these students in the manner that they make themselves available to the parents of the students enrolled in the school where she/he teaches.

We have reviewed the actual practices in the Industrial Arts and Home Economics programs in our Division. Each center was asked to submit its proposal - a plan to offer completely integrated courses. We held several meetings with the staff and finally have accepted the following plan:

- That all beginning in September 1980, the program be completely integrated and that class size determine the class composition .
- That all Grade 7 students be exposed to all 4 areas in their first year as a class for 2 ½ months modules, i.e. 7A would spend time in Drafting and Textiles and Woodworking.
- That all students be exposed to two areas when they are in Grade 8, i.e. Drafting and Textiles.
- That the classes be exposed to the remaining two areas in Grade 9, i.e. Woodworking and Nutrition.

The intention is to develop programs that are really life-time skills oriented. Skills that all people need. Units on budgeting, child care and home decorating can be incorporated.
